Dazsa Carter is a Kansas City, Missouri native. She received a B.S. in Agricultural Business from Langston University in 2005. As a student she was passionate regarding many social issues and was an active member of the National Council of Negro Women (NCNW); Minorities in Agriculture, Natural Resources and Related Sciences (MANRRS); Student Government, and lead initiatives such as the International Day of Service as an active member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.

She started her early career working with REYAP, an organization based in Oklahoma that focuses on exposing minorities to careers in agriculture. In 2009, she joined the staff of her alma mater, where gained experience in Financial Aid, Admissions and Enrollment Management.

In 2013 she took her skills to the Tulsa Regional Chamber in the Government Affairs Department. In her role as the Coordinator of Government Affairs, she was quickly appointed the chair of the Diversity and Inclusion taskforce. Under her leadership, she led the Tulsa Regional Chamber staff in addressing contentious current events such as the murder of Mike Brown, discussions on religious beliefs and addressing our biases. This work led to an active participation with Mosaic, a diversity business council whose initiative is to influence businesses to create diverse and inclusive workplaces as well as lifelong relationships with D&I champions in the Tulsa community.

Dazsa is the Assistant Director of the Oklahoma Association of Career and Technical Education (OKACTE), an organization that serves more than 4,500 CareerTech professionals statewide. She prides herself in championing the efforts and desires of the OkACTE membership, while they prepare qualified and trained members of Oklahoma's workforce.
